Last Week's Meeting - June 7 - Dr. Robert Nagourney - Treatment of Cancer



Dr. Robert Nagourney has been an internationally recognized pioneer in cancer research and personalized cancer treatment for over 20 years. He is the founder and medical director of Nagourney Cancer Institute (formerly Rational Therapeutics) and Clinical Professor at the University of California, Irvine School of Medicine. Dr. Nagourney's goals are to change the way cancer is treated and to make Long Beach the first cancer therapy destination resort. Billions of dollars are spent on cancer research focusing on how different gene elements react with one another at a certain point. Every cancer has a mutation that in itself is not a DNA, but uses DNA (like a blueprint to a building). Dr. Nagourney believes that cancer cannot be indentified by the genetic makeup, but by the metabolic profile. Nagourney's institute provides laboratory tests that simulate human cells (in test tubes) and by their response can predict accurately the response of the individual's cells to various treatment medications. By individualizing the treatment -- time, money and lives can be saved.

Also Last Week Marcelle Epley representing the LB Rotary Scholarship Foundation announced the Mark Bixby Leadership Award. The recipient is Darrian Royce Talamantes who, as an existing Rotary Scholar at CSULB, receives a \$3,000 award. Talamantes was selected for his exemplary community dedication and determination to become a microbiologist serving with the next generaton of scientists. 
